#3GOOD REASONS

1 The language and historical-cultural courses are divided into two syllabuses. They provide in-depth study in the fields of law and economics (work-oriented) or literature and teaching (for future teachers and trainers)

2 Experience different cultures, traditions, and teaching methodologies to get to know the world: UNISOB has agreements with approximately 100 European universities where students can study or join internships through the EU Erasmus Plus programme

3 Internationalization, integration, cooperation: a balanced synthesis of laboratory experiences and critical reading methodologies for the contemporary world to shape young people's awareness of Europe's common European heritage

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

In addition to a full preparation in two chosen languages (English, French, German and Spanish), the course guarantees complete, wide-ranging, methodologically updated training suited to the demands of the current increasingly intense practice of international exchanges in the world of culture and work.

Students can choose one of the following syllabuses:

Languages for international communication, aimed at training students for internationally recognized professional roles and an excellent working knowledge of two European languages (besides Italian). Students will broaden their knowledge of international political and social issues, as well as the economic and legal disciplines that regulate relations between States and institutions, learning to recognize and use terminology specific to different professions. They will also learn to use and handle the principal IT tools and online communication methods;

European languages, literatures, and cultures, for those wishing to qualify as trainers and teachers of other languages and literatures or Italian for Speakers of Other Languages, in Italy and abroad.

Graduates will be able to work as editors and reviewers of multilingual texts in their chosen languages; they will be able to perform historical-critical analysis of literary texts using appropriate terminology and will develop an area-specific teaching and training methodology suitable for use in schools at every level.

PROFESSIONAL PROFILES

Graduates will have acquired translation, communication, and mediation skills in multilingual professional contexts and will be able to take on highly responsible positions in public and private corporations in the commercial, marketing, and human resources sectors, as well as with companies involved in economic globalization processes. They

may also find employment in international organizations operating in the fields of cooperation and development aid, in addition to bodies and institutions involved in the processes of development and economic, social, and cultural integration, as well as in diplomatic and consular service.

This degree may be a requirement for access to open competition procedures for teaching foreign languages, cultures, and literature in secondary schools and Italian for Speakers of Other Languages (Italian L2).

REQUIREMENTS AND ACCESS MODALITIES

The courses are open to graduates from the following disciplines: L-11 (Modern Languages, literatures, and cultures), L-12 (Linguistic and cultural mediation); 11 (Modern Languages, literatures and cultures), 3 (Linguistic and cultural mediation), provided that the languages studied on the three-year undergraduate course are the same as those chosen for the master's degree. Access is also granted to all graduates who have earned at least 90 ECTS as follows: 24 ECTS in the first language and translation sector; 24 ECTS in the second language and translation sector; 6 CFU in L-LIN / 01; at least 36 CFU between L-FIL-LET / 10, L-FIL-LET / 12, L-LIN / 02, SPS / 02, IUS / 14, M-STO / 02.

Only students who meet the requirements will be admitted.

Prior to admittance, current legislation requires all potential students to attend an interview, which can be booked through the online requirements verification procedure, available at www.unisob.na.it

TO ENROL

Aspiring students must enrol online through the University website: www.unisob.na.it, from 1 June 2022 until the maximum number of places has been reached.

Online services

Students will have a dedicated section on the website, a virtual room to receive information on their course, choose laboratory activities, book exams, download teaching materials, request a supervisor for the final dissertation, an institutional e-mail address, and Wi-Fi access points in the study rooms and in the library

University fees

Fees vary depending on income (for Italy-based students: see I.S.E.E. certification - the University 2023 form) and fall into 6 different brackets starting at € 1,795.70. To establish your contribution bracket go to www.unisob.na.it/universita/normeamministrative/fasce.htm

Those who obtained a score of 110/110 for their first degree are entitled to a reduction of € 150.00 on the final instalment.

Payment can be made in instalments. There is a 7.5% discount on the total amount if the entire sum due is paid in a single instalment
